Psi Phi Chapter Annual Golf Tournament Held at Reynolds Park

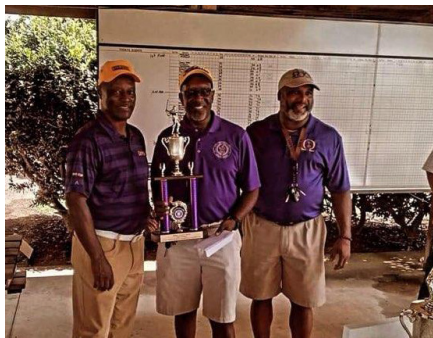

PSI PHI HANDS OUT AWARDS AT ACHIEVEMENT WEEK

Psi Phi chapter held a weeklong of activities as part of International Achievement Week from November 11-17. The theme was "Omega Men Building a Better Society with Friendship as a Foundation." The activities got under way on Veterans Day with a breakfast to honor local veterans, followed the next day with a virtual wellness seminar by Psi Phi Chapter and Beta Beta Chapter – Psi Phi Brother John Card presenting. The following evening, Psi Phi brothers volunteered at Samaritan Ministries soup kitchen and homeless shelter.

The week culminated with a fellowship church service at Mt. BRO. MAGRUDER TO HEAD HBCU BAND DIRECTORS

The HBCU National Band and Orchestra Directors' Consortium has appointed Winston-Salem State University's director of bands, Dr. Michael Magruder, as its president. In this prestigious role, Brother Magruder, a member of Psi Phi Chapter, leads the only national conference specifically tailored for HBCU band directors and students for a two-year term, which started in 2024.

The HBCU-NBODC is committed to advancing musical excellence at Historically Black Colleges and Universities by uniting music educators, directors, and performers nationwide. The consortium's significant focuses are collaboration and professional development. The consortium ensures that student musicians receive the mentorship and resources they need to succeed. It also aims to celebrate the legacy of Black music while fostering innovation and growth for future musical leaders.

As president of the HBCU-NBODC, Brother Magruder will act as the official spokesperson for HBCU direc-

tors and actively encourage other HBCU band directors to attend the 2025 conference. He will also work closely with the consortium's executive board to plan the convention, which will serve as a forum for exchanging creative concepts, industry best practices, and materials to improve music education.

The Jackson, Mississippi native graduated in 1979 from Louisiana State University with a Master of Music in clarinet performance. In 2001, he received a PhD from the University of Mississippi. Before moving on to director positions at other schools, including Texas College and Jackson State University, he started his career as band director at Sadie V. Thompson Jr. High School in Natchez, Mississippi.

Since joining Winston-Salem State in 2004, Brother Magruder has cultivated the Red Sea of Sound Marching Band into an award-winning ensemble. Under his leadership, band members have earned scholarships and awards recognizing their talent.

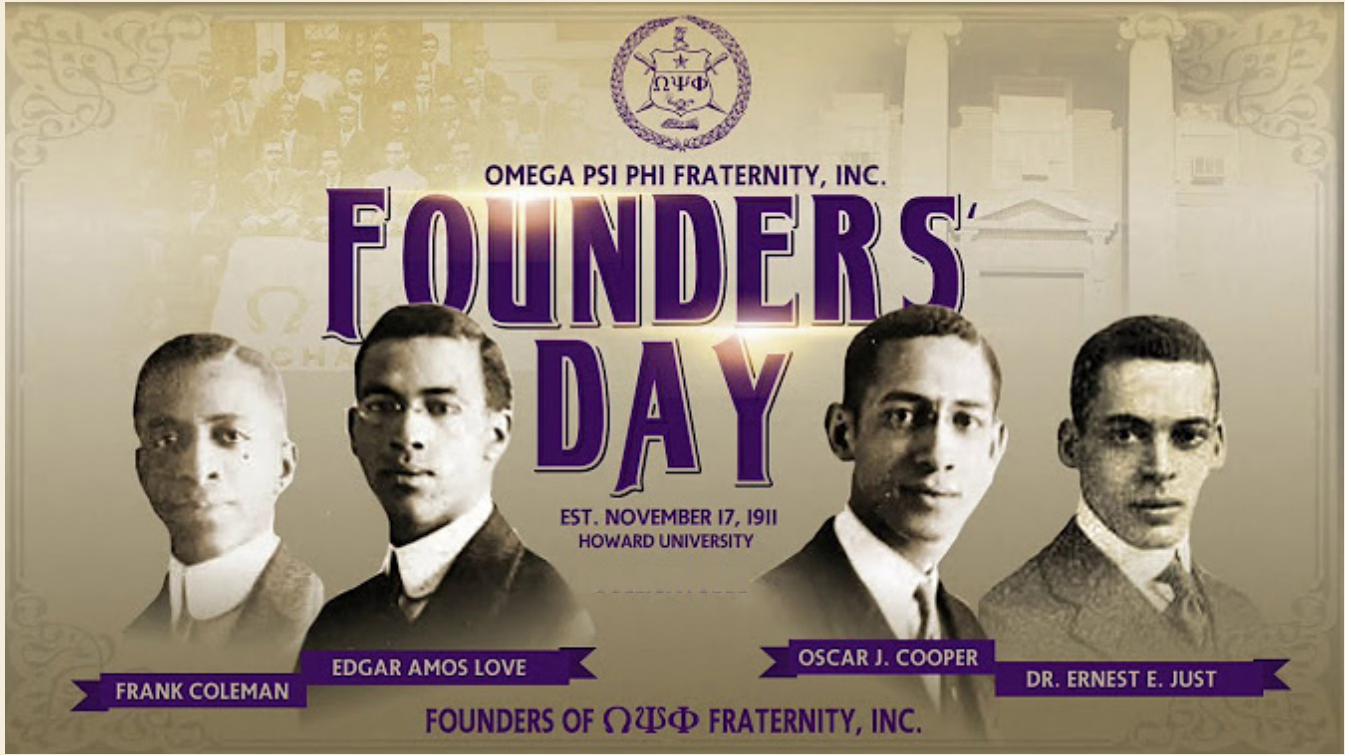

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CHAPTER TO HOLD MEN'S HEALTH SUMMIT

Psi Phi Chapter will host a Men's Health Summit on Saturday, June 6, at the YMCA Reach Center at Winston Lake, bringing together community leaders, healthcare professionals and residents for a morning dedicated to wellness and empowerment. The event will run from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. and is organized by the chapter's Health Initiatives Committee, co-chaired by Brother Dr. John Card and Brother Rodrike Roberts.

The summit is designed to address critical health disparities impacting Black men by providing access to education, resources and preventative care services. Attendees will have the opportunity to receive free dental screenings and health screenings, including blood pressure checks and glucose testing, aimed at promoting early detection and encouraging proactive health management.

Beyond screenings, the event will feature educational sessions and community engagement focused on improving spiritual, nutritional, mental and physical health. Organizers emphasize that the summit is not just about awareness, but about equipping participants with practical tools and knowledge to make lasting lifestyle changes.

Black men in the U.S. face significant health disparities, including higher rates of chronic conditions like hypertension, diabetes and heart disease, often driven by systemic barriers to quality healthcare, economic inequality and chronic stress from discrimination. These factors contribute to shorter life expectancies and poorer overall health outcomes compared to other demographic groups.
